- _____ 2. Did you get tested for COVID-19 but the test came back negative?
- _____ 3. Have you been exposed to someone with COVID-19 but never became ill and did not get tested?
- _____ 4. Do you work in a high exposure area? (Healthcare workers, first responders, nursing home personnel, home visitors, supermarket workers, pharmacy workers, etc.)?
- _____ 5. Have you been exposed through travel, work and/or mass transit use?
- _____ 6. Are you concerned that you may have been infected because you live in the greater NY area?

How to interpret your results:

Positive: If your test comes back positive, it means most likely that you have been infected with the virus that causes COVID-19. There may be a small number of people that have a false positive result, but this appears to be less than 1-2%. We cannot say at this time whether a positive antibody result is an indication that you are protected from getting infected again. We also do not know how long your antibodies will last.

Negative: If your test comes back negative, it means that you have not been infected with the virus that causes COVID-19. On rare occasions, the test may be falsely negative but that is most likely to occur if your infection occurred less than 2 weeks before your blood was drawn. A negative result means that you are susceptible to getting the COVID-19 infection.
